High School Federation Rules and Regulations (NHSF) will apply with the following exceptions:

- I. Game Length: 7th & 8th two 16 minute halves; 3rd to 6th two 14 minute halves
- II. No game will start before the scheduled time unless both head coaches agree. There will be a minimum of a 5 minute warm-up period.
- III. Halftime will be 3 minutes unless both coaches agree to start earlier.
- IV. Timeouts will be awarded under NHSF rules (3 Full / 2 Thirty Second)
- V. Overtime: 3 minutes for Grade School (grades 3 thru 6); 4 minutes for Middle and High School (grades 7 thru 11)
- VI. The clock will stop for all whistle stoppages
- VII. Two (2) direct technical fouls during a game on a player, coach, or team representative will result in their disqualification for the next game of the tournament. Fighting and gross unsportsmanlike behavior can be more than one game or result in the entire team disqualified from tournament and is at the discretion of the Tournament Director or Site Director.
- VIII. Each team is responsible for their warm-up and game balls and or any other items brought into the game.
- IX. All teams are expected to arrive for games thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled start times. Scorebooks must be filled out and marked with starters before the official game time. If a team is not on the court at the scheduled game time an official forfeit will be declared. If any team that is knowingly unable to make their scheduled game must notify the Tournament Director in advance. In bracket play, if a team cannot advance, the losing team advances as if they had won the previous game.
- X. If a team forfeits two games by not participating; the team will be disqualified from the event and cannot participate in bracket / tournament play.
- XI. Players will be allowed to play for one team only. Once a player plays in a game for one team, she will no longer be eligible to participate for any other team in the tournament.
- XII. In Pool Play, the home team is the first team listed and will wear light colored jerseys and sit to the left of the scorekeeper facing the court.
- XIII. In Bracket Play, the home team is the bottom team on the bracket will wear light colored jerseys and sit to the left of the scorekeeper facing the court.

Roster Rules:

- I. Rosters are allowed a maximum of fifteen (15) players.
- II. Proof of age and / or grade is required for all players on roster. Acceptable proofs of age are; clean photocopies of birth certificates, adoption papers, or immigration papers. Proof of grade is a clean copy of any report card of the current school year or school document that indicates current grade level. Teams are required to have proof of age and grade upon check-in.
- III. No roster additions will be permitted after the team has begun play of its first tournament game within any tournament.

Mercy Rule:

- I. Once a team is leading by 20 points anytime in a game, the clock will continue to run. The only time the clock will stop is for injuries or timeouts. If the lead falls below 10 points, the clock will again be stopped for all whistle stoppages.
- II. Home team must provide book keeper. First team listed is home team and wears light color Uniforms.

Tie-Breakers:

- I. Two Teams Tied: Head-to-head result.
- II. Three or more teams: Point Differential System will be used. Teams will receive a point differential per game up to a maximum of plus 20 points for a win and a maximum of minus 20 points for loss. The team with the highest point total will win the tiebreaker and the second highest number will be seeded second, etc. If two teams are tied with points, then revert back to head-to-head. The team not involved in the tiebreaker will have its games eliminated. If the teams are still tied, the team with the fewest points allowed in ALL games played in pool play wins. A forfeit is scored as a 20-0 game.

Player, Coaches and Spectator Conduct:

- I. All participates, coaches and spectators shall refrain from using profanity or verbal abuse towards other players, coaches, spectators, referees and the tournament staff.
- II. This is a Drug and Alcohol Free Event. No alcoholic beverages, drugs or cigarette smoking are allowed on the premises. Any coach or player(s) engaged in the use of alcohol, drugs or cigarette smoking will be disqualified from further participation in the tournament.
- III. Team coaches will be responsible for the conduct of their players and parents. Teams and spectators shall abide by the tournament rules and regulations.
- IV. No food or beverages are allowed in the gymnasium. Only water and sport drinks are permitted for players during games.
- V. All teams must clean their bench area at the end of their game.
- VI. The Tournament Director and the tournament staff are not responsible for any personal items that are left behind, lost or stolen.
